

Pentecost Sunday

A very warm welcome to all those joining us in our virtual worship today. If possible, use this service at 10am so we are worshipping together. It is particularly relevant today as it would have been a Joint Service for our two Churches being the fifth Sunday in the month.

Try saying the parts in bold aloud.



Introduction

The arrival of the promised gift of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost completes and crowns the Easter Festival. This Sunday marks the day when the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles and it is also known as the birth of the Christian Church as we know it today. Pentecost fulfils the Jesus promise that God would send another Counsellor and Spirit of Truth (John Chapter 14 verses 16 and 17)

Opening Response

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you
And also with you

Jesus Christ, whom we worship, is our crucified, risen and ascended Lord and we have walked with him through his journey of love.

We have faced the agony of his suffering and death on a cross.

We have rejoiced at his bursting free from the bonds of death.

We have enjoyed his risen presence with us and his revelation of himself through the breaking of bread.

We have seen his return to the throne before which every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that this Jesus is Lord.

And now, with the followers of his own time, we await the coming of the promised Holy Spirit, his gift to his people, through whom we make Christ known to the world.

Confession

Christ died to sin once for all, and now he lives to God.

Let us renew our resolve to have done with all that is evil and confess our sins in penitence and faith. *cf Romans 6.10*

Let us begin by reflecting on the week that has just passed:

Consider the things which we have done, or not done, or even our thoughts which we now wish to say sorry to God for:

Let us then return to the Lord our God and say to him:

Father, we have sinned against heaven and against you. We are not worthy to be called your children. We turn to you again. Have mercy on us, bring us back to yourself as those who once were dead but now have life through Christ our Lord.

Absolution:

If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. Amen. 1 John 1:8-9

Collect for today

Let us pray that the Spirit will work through our lives to bring Christ to the world.

**God, who as at this time taught the hearts of your faithful people by sending to them the light of your Holy Spirit: grant us by the same Spirit to have a right judgement in all things and evermore to rejoice in his holy comfort; through the merits of Christ Jesus our Saviour, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Readings for today

Our first reading is taken from John Chapter 7 verses 37 to 39:

³⁷ On the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, 'Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. ³⁸ Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them.' ³⁹ By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive. Up to that time the Spirit had not been given, since Jesus had not yet been glorified.

This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Our second reading is taken from Acts Chapter 2 verses 1 to 21:

The Holy Spirit comes at Pentecost.

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

⁵ Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. ⁶ When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. ⁷ Utterly amazed, they asked: 'Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans?' ⁸ Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? ⁹ Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome ¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs – we hear them declaring the wonders of

God in our own tongues!’¹² Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, ‘What does this mean?’

¹³ Some, however, made fun of them and said, ‘They have had too much wine.’

Peter addresses the crowd.

¹⁴ Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: ‘Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. ¹⁵ These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It’s only nine in the morning! ¹⁶ No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:

¹⁷ “In the last days, God says,

I will pour out my Spirit on all people.

Your sons and daughters will prophesy,

your young men will see visions,

your old men will dream dreams.

¹⁸ Even on my servants, both men and women,

I will pour out my Spirit in those days,

and they will prophesy.

¹⁹ I will show wonders in the heavens above

and signs on the earth below,

blood and fire and billows of smoke.

²⁰ The sun will be turned to darkness

and the moon to blood

before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord.

²¹ And everyone who calls

on the name of the Lord will be saved.”

This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God

Talk

Open our ears, O Lord, to hear your word and know your voice. Speak to our hearts and strengthen our wills, that we may serve you today and always. Amen

I wonder if, like me, you get excited by Pentecost Sunday? For me, Christmas Day, Easter Sunday and Pentecost Sunday are the three most exciting and, I believe, greatest days of our church calendar. They are special gift days and who doesn’t get excited at the thought of gifts?



Each of these days tell of the story of Jesus; Christmas Day sees Baby Jesus born as “Emmanuel / God with us,” gifted by Father God to humankind. Easter Sunday sees Jesus’ overcoming death and sin in his resurrection bringing the gift of eternal life for all humankind in restored relationship with God in and through Jesus and Pentecost Sunday sees God’s promised gift of the Holy Spirit to all who believe, the final act of Jesus’ saving ministry before he finally returns to bring us back to himself. Each of these gifts ‘given once, and for all; the people of God always and everywhere now benefitting from Jesus ministry.’

Our second reading tells us Pentecost Sunday is the day the Holy Spirit was gifted to Jesus' disciples. In Greek, Pentecost means "fiftieth" and is traditionally celebrated by the Jewish people fifty days after the Passover. Pentecost is also known as the "Festival of the weeks, the day of the first fruits and the festival of the harvest" a festival given as law to the people of God, the Israelites, through Moses, whereby God tells them to keep his commandments so that they will know him as holy and sanctified. (If you want to read more see Leviticus 22:31-33 and 23:9-16)

Not only is Pentecost a holy festival celebrated by Jews, but because of Jesus' promise to his disciples before his ascension into heaven, the coming of the Holy Spirit that day means it is also a day of great celebration for Christians, for it is the Christian church's birthday.

For many Christians the story of Pentecost is a familiar one. It tells us that the disciples returned to Jerusalem following Jesus' ascension and together with other followers of Jesus they devoted themselves to prayer (Acts 1:12-14) Gathered on Pentecost, suddenly an extra-ordinary event occurred; "the rushing sound of a violent wind filled the room, divided tongues, as of fire, appeared – one tongue rested on each of those gathered, and filled with the Holy Spirit, they began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability" (Acts 2:2-4).

Now, you might naturally think that experiencing something like this might have been quite terrifying, but not once are we told that anyone was afraid! Indeed, we are told that the disciples simply began speaking, in a variety of different languages, that other Jews gathered in this multicultural city were able to interpret as their own. Languages, Luke the author of Acts expressed to have gone as far and as wide as the whole of the Graeco-Roman world situated around the Mediterranean basin of his time (Acts 2:9-11).

Emboldened and Empowered

The gifted Holy Spirit brought about an immediate change in Jesus' disciples who were **emboldened and empowered** to be primary witnesses of Jesus. This gift birthed a new unity in God which transcends all human barriers of race, nationality and language. We see this initially in Peter, who begins to speak to the gathered wider community who heard them. Peter – remember a fisherman -spoke to this curious crowd with power, confidence and God-given authority about the truth of what had actually happened, and declaring the fulfilment of Joel's prophecy that God will pour his Spirit out on all people.

Equipped

The coming of the Holy Spirit meant that all the disciples were properly **equipped**, by God, to continue the work of Jesus' ministry beyond his ascent to his Father. The spirit-filled believers were there and then equipped to go out and tell the nations; Jesus had told them "you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

Enabled

What I love most about the story of Pentecost is that God's promised and gracious gifting to the people of God is one that is generous and lavish. When God gives he

doesn't hold back; God gifts abundantly, not sprinkling or even showering but pouring out his Holy Spirit to each of us so that we are overwhelmed and drenched with the overflowing Spirit who shares God's love with us, in us and through us. That is the gift God wants for each of his children. A gift of 'new life, of joy, of fellowship and worship with our sisters and brothers, of boldness and power' that only God can give and we are unable to contain within ourselves.

Jesus' promised gifting means that we, as his followers, are **enabled** and become secondary witnesses of Jesus and his presence with us here and now. We too are 'anointed and equipped' by almighty God. Whilst the disciples that day experienced the unusual phenomena of the sound of wind and tongues of fire, we, like them, can still experience the same today; the gift of tongues (languages of some kind) and confidence in God's saving grace. The kingdom of Jesus draws people to himself in and through us in the power of the Holy Spirit, when we share with others who don't yet know or understand God's love for them, our delight in him and he in us. The gift of the Holy Spirit was not a one-off event – it is for the time of the kingdom of Jesus – from the very first Pentecost until Jesus returns. And it is for us now.

This week I had the great privilege of separately meeting two wonderful 91 year old ladies who both exude God's Holy Spirit. They both told me wonderful stories of their lives from very young to their present day. From their hospital beds each expressed the joy of knowing Jesus for much of their lives and how the gift of the Holy Spirit had enabled them to weather the storms and the sunshine of life. And believe me they had both had very difficult things happen through their lives. When we prayed together, one of the ladies prayed in tongues. I had taken each of them a new 'Hope' magazine produced by Gideons, packed full of sumptuous glossy photos with Bible verses and by the next morning one of them had already gifted hers away to one of the nurses! I thought I'd take her up a pile next time I visit and see how quickly they are gifted away 😊. My time with each of them has been wonderful and beautiful and I thank God for the amazing witnesses they are for Jesus even at 91, because I know it wasn't just me they were sharing their stories with!! This, I know without doubt, is the work of the Holy Spirit in them.

The Good News (Gospel) of Jesus can never spread without the enabling of the Holy Spirit, then and now.

The late John Stott, (some of you may have heard of him?) wrote "Without the Holy Spirit, Christian discipleship would be inconceivable, even impossible. There can be no life without the life-giver..... As a body without breath, so the church without the Spirit is dead."

In our first reading John tells us that Jesus said "Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them.' God longs to pour out his Spirit on each of his children because he wants to bless us and equip us to participate in bringing his kingdom in, here and now.

Ask yourselves "Am I aware of the good gifts God longs for me to receive? Am I resistant to what God wants to lavish on me?"

Today we celebrate the very beginning of Christ's Church, established through the Holy Spirit's equipping and enabling of Jesus' disciples and apostles. The Church is the beloved people of God who truly believe in Father, Son and Holy Spirit, their love, redemption and empowering of us, his children, to share God's blessings for us

with others. As with the gift of God's saving grace, we cannot do anything to earn this gift except to trust and believe that God's gift is for us and to say "Yes, thank you God."

The gift of the Holy Spirit goes further and it's OK to ask for this gift, given through Baptism, to be renewed in you today. Don't be afraid of the consequences. God wants nothing but the very best for us and he alone knows what passion for him will be stoked up from within. What may currently be a gently smouldering ember might become the brightest burning forest fire of love for him that you've ever known. A glorious gift that cannot be contained..... one that spreads infectiously in a wonderful way. One that others won't be able to avoid One that everyone will want to catch!

Do you dare to believe that God will do this? Who doesn't want to unwrap that exciting and amazing gift from God this morning? The gift God wants to lavish on you if you ask him to rekindle the power of the Holy Spirit within you. And this gift brings about beautiful blessings for our life too (see Galatians 5:22 -23a).

Happy Birthday to all our Church family throughout the world. Praise God for his love and his mighty acts.

Today let's pray that God will indeed pour his Spirit upon us individually and corporately as his church and let's trust and believe that he will.

Coronavirus Guidance

Following Church of England advice, there are no services of public worship at Holy Trinity or St Peter's Church for the foreseeable future. This sadly includes all baptisms and weddings. The situation with funerals is also extremely difficult for those mourning the loss of a loved one.

Please hold in your prayers all those couples and families who are affected by this. The Churches' Premises are closed to everyone- please do not attempt to access them with any keys that you may have.

Daily Hope

Daily Hope is a free phone line of hymns, reflections and prayers launched by the Church of England. It has been set up particularly with those unable to join online church services during the period of restrictions in mind. So, if you know someone in this situation, please phone them and tell them about free-phone **0800 804 8044**, and why not try it for yourselves.

Food Bank

Obviously due the measures taken to deal with the coronavirus we are not able to continue with the bringing of items to Church or deliveries to the warehouse.

This is at a time when the Food Bank is under huge pressure, especially with schools closed.

In the three weeks from April 19th, the food bank has distributed food to 332 people including 104 children (9.26 tons)

The food bank is still working with its volunteers and there are collection points in most supermarkets. If you are visiting a supermarket for your own shopping please consider adding a few items to donate in this way. A list of the most urgently required items can be found on the food bank website.

Please note, they are no longer able to accept infant formula milk or baby food due to a UNICEF directive.

Can we urge everyone to consider if they can give a donation of money?

This is a really valuable way we can collectively as a Church show our love to the vulnerable people in our society.

Scams - Be careful

Please be aware there are an increased number of scams doing the rounds trying to take advantage of these difficult times. Before clicking on links, giving out bank details etc... do check they are genuine as there are some very plausible and convincing scammers.

Library Books and Services

As you all know libraries are currently closed to the public and you may run out of reading material during the lock down / isolation.

However WCC Library is still working remotely and anyone who is not already a member can join remotely. In particular it is possible to access and download e-books through their services.

All you need to access these for free are your library card number and email address. Visit <https://library.warwickshire.gov.uk/> to find out how.



Parish Giving Scheme- Launch of New Telephone Service

This is information for Holy Trinity only, for those who have already got this service set up...

As you may know we have introduced a new way that people can give to the church on a regular basis (planned giving). It involves setting up a Direct Debit from your bank and making a regular, usually monthly, donation to the church. It is easier than cash giving and allows you to review your contributions annually with a view to keeping in line with inflation. This note is to make everyone aware that this facility can now be set-up over the phone with the Parish Giving Scheme staff. The phone number is **0333 002 1271**.

We fully appreciate that in the current circumstances, the timing of this may not be right for everyone but if you do want to set this facility up you will need the following information:

Your bank account details (Sort code, account number, name of bank and address)

The name of the parish (Holy Trinity Hartshill Nuneaton)

You will be asked if you would like to increase your gift in line with inflation each year (this is not compulsory and you have the ability to say 'No' each year).

You will be asked if you would like to gift aid your donation.

You will need the PGS code for the parish (For Hartshill this is **110611081**).

The leaflet below has more details if you need them.

Leaflet details

The Parish Giving Scheme is delighted to announce the launch of a new telephone service, designed to enable prospective donors to set up a regular Direct Debit donation to your parish **over the phone**.

How will it work?

The service will go live on Monday 27th April 2020 and will operate weekdays between 9 - 5pm.

Please encourage prospective donors to set up a regular gift to your parish by calling our dedicated telephone line: **0333 002 1271**

One of our administrators will take them through the sign up process – this normally takes around 15 minutes. They will need to have the following information to hand:

- Personal bank account details
- The name of the parish they wish to donate to
- They will need to confirm if they want to increase their gift in line with inflation each year
- Confirm if they are eligible for Gift Aid
- The PGS code for their parish (usually 9 digits in length) *

***Note: This is the one piece of information that the donor will not have. Please ensure they have this information, to guarantee the gift goes to the correct parish.**

What happens next?

Donors will receive written confirmation (by email or post) of their Direct Debit, including details of the parish they are supporting, the amount of their gift and the date of their first donation.

Please note that if they currently give to the church via standing order, we advise them to wait until receiving the confirmation letter from PGS before attempting to cancel it.

How will our parish be notified of the donation?

The parish's Planned Giving representative will receive a monthly statement, detailing the names of those who have donated (unless they choose to remain anonymous) and all the gifts given through the PGS.

What if they need to change their donation?

If donors wish to make any changes to their Direct Debit, they should notify a member of the PGS team by phone 0333 002 1260, email info@parishgiving.org.uk or in writing to the address below.
