## **CHRISTIAN CHARITY NEWS**

### **MISSION AVIATION FELLOWSHIP (MAF)**

MAF was set up just over 70 years ago, when in 1944 Murray Kendon from New Zealand and serving in the RAF had a vision of how aviation could be used to spread the Christian faith in remote areas, in contrast to flying planes in conflict. Others shared his vision and as a group supported him in years of praying, planning and raising funds to buy a small plane and in 1947 a small 4 seater Gemini plane was dedicated for service. Early in 1948 two men took off on a 4,000 mile journey to Kenya which entailed more than 20 refuelling stops through France and across Africa and as the plane wasn't suitable for night flights, overnight stays were essential in many countries in Africa. The journey took 27 days flying over deserts, mountainous terrain and grasslands, landing in fields or clearances in a forested area at times.

From this early beginning MAF has grown immensely and they now have around 135 planes taking off or landing every 3 or 4 minutes in many African countries and other remote places including Mongolia, Asia, Central and South America, Papua New Guinea and Arnhem Land in Northern Territory, Australia and many missionaries from all over the world serve the Lord with MAF bringing the Good News of Jesus to remote areas and helping with the many varied needs of people - from distributing food in disaster areas, delivering building and educational materials or transporting people with medical needs to a hospital. Try to imagine how you'd feel if you'd been bitten by a snake and needing urgent medication when a hospital might be a 5 day journey on foot or by road; but only 1 hour away by plane. Many mothers' and babies' lives have been saved when the mother has been in labour with complications and a plane

has been available to get her to hospital in time. It must be a very rewarding return journey for the pilot bringing 2 healthy people home.

It is a charity which helps many other charities, mission societies and aid workers and very much valued by around 1,500 different organizations, some of which have appeared in previous editions of this magazine, although the original vision of sharing God's love with people who haven't heard about Jesus is still their main focus. It is very varied work and can be very dangerous work too in some places. One day MAF may be taking a Christian clinical team to a remote area to set up an operating clinic to perform cataract operations; another day to deliver food and emergency supplies to an earthquake area, another taking Bible translators to a village and still another taking the Archbishop of Canterbury to visit Christians in a remote area! On occasions they may be required to evacuate mission staff from very dangerous areas when conflict arises.

It is not only pilots involved, but flight engineers, ground staff and administration staff are required too. In the UK volunteers are welcome in speaking and fund raising roles.

13<sup>th</sup> – A prayer for the broken hearted. 'The Lord is near to the broken hearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit'. Psalm 34:18.

## Sharon's February Recipes – Chocolate Truffles (makes 36)

### Ingredients

5 floz/150ml fresh double cream  
12oz/350g plain chocolate, broken up  
2 tbsp/30ml liqueur  
1oz/25g butter  
Extra chocolate for dipping  
Grated white and plain chocolate for decoration

### Method

1. Heat cream in a small pan until boiling, remove from heat and add chocolate, stir until melted
2. Stir in liqueur and butter, mix until butter has melted. Pour into a bowl
3. Freeze until firm enough to hold its shape, about 20 minutes
4. Using a melon baller or similar, scoop out rounds and place on non-stick baking paper and chill until firm
5. Either roll each truffle in a little cool, melted chocolate in your hands or dip into melted chocolate
6. Roll a third in grated white chocolate, a third in grated plain chocolate and leave the remainder plain
7. Place in small paper cases and store in the fridge.

## Chocolate Orange Truffles (makes 36)

### Ingredients

8oz/225g plain chocolate  
3oz/50g butter  
2oz/50g icing sugar  
2 tbsp/30ml fresh double cream  
Grated rind of 1 orange  
1 tbsp / 30 ml orange liqueur  
3oz/75g biscuits, crushed  
Drinking chocolate powder

### Method

1. Place chocolate in a bowl over a pan of hot water and heat until melted
2. Stir sugar, cream, orange rind, liqueur and biscuits crumbs into melted chocolate
3. Leave until firm, then roll spoonfuls into balls
4. Refrigerate until firm
5. Roll in drinking chocolate powder before serving

## **The Presentation of Christ in the Temple/ Candlemas**

In bygone centuries, Christians said their last farewells to the Christmas season on Candlemas, 2 February. This is exactly 40 days after Christmas Day itself.

In New Testament times 40 days old was an important age for a baby boy: it was when they made their first ‘public appearance’. Mary, like all good Jewish mothers, went to the Temple with Jesus, her first male child - to ‘present him to the Lord’. At the same time, she, as a new mother, was ‘purified’. Thus we have the Festival of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple.

So where does the Candlemas bit come in? Jesus is described in the New Testament as the Light of the World, and early Christians developed the tradition of lighting many candles in celebration of this day. The Church also fell into the custom of blessing the year’s supply of candles for the church on this day - hence the name, Candlemas.

The story of how Candlemas began can be found in Luke 2:22-40. Simeon’s great declaration of faith and recognition of who Jesus was is of course found in the Nunc Dimittis, which is embedded in the Office of Evening Prayer in the West. But in medieval times, the Nunc Dimittis was mostly used just on this day, during the distribution of candles before the Eucharist. Only gradually did it win a place in the daily prayer life of the Church.
